- Just because an animal is "being so good and letting us do this" does not mean it's OK to make that animal endure whatever it is you're doing.
- Ask for drugs! "Life is better through chemistry" theory

- \bullet "Get into their head", have compassion, have confidence and <code>EXHALE</code>

we can do


If possible, have a quiet room just for patient restraint

















Numb the cornea with Proparacaine

Debride with a cotton tipped applicator -ORDiamond burr debridement with contact lens
placement

E-collar for 2 weeks until recheck – remove contact

Moxifloxacin and an oral NSAID (Rimadyl, Metacam)
and or Gabapentin





Aaaaand.....Exhale.....breathe deep.....exhale...










