<u>Things To Watch For When It's Been A Ruff Day:</u> <u>In Boarding or Daycare</u>

- → Sore Pads: Playing ruff may be tuff on your dog's feet and they may get sore and get abraded pads. This will go away as their pads get thicker and used to running on different surfaces.
- → Sore Muscles: Your dog will be having so much fun playing that they may forget to pace themselves. This will result in sore muscles. Over time, this will fade as you see them get stronger and more in shape.
- → Exhaustion: The new social interaction your dog will encounter while being in daycare or boarding will be physically and mentally exhausting. He/She will need a lot of rest when they get home. Although they have access to fresh water all day long, it will be normal for your dog to drink lots of water when they get home.
- → Wet Coat (Daycare): Your dog's coat may be wet when you pick them up, so we always suggest that you keep a dry towel in your car when you come to pick up. Between the misters in the park and lounging in the pool, your dog will get wet.
