Blue Boy has since returned home to his loving family and is doing well.

All three were treated for a soft tissue sarcoma, a category of tumors found anywhere in the body that arise from the connective, muscle, or nervous tissues. Each had surgery to remove as much of the cancerous growth as possible. This was followed by a series of radiation treatments using TrueBeam, an advanced medical linear accelerator. TrueBeam utilizes electron beams to precisely target cancerous tumors to prevent or delay the chance of any tumor regrowth.



A board-certified specialist's expertise complements the care provided by your primary care veterinarian. In addition to completing a veterinary degree (Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine, DVM), a board-certified veterinary specialist must complete an internship, a two to four-year specialized residency, and publish a paper in a peer-reviewed journal. Specialists must also undergo a series of exams based on knowledge and skill in the given specialty.
